Friday, June 27th: Worcester Art Museum (WAM).

This gem of a museum houses over 35,000 works of art dating from antiquity to the present day, representing cultures from all over the world. Only three months after the closing of Worcester's Higgins Armory Museum, the WAM acquired much of the Armory's collection. The new "*Knights*" exhibition marks the first step in the long-term integration of arms and armor into the collection of the Worcester Art Museum.

This museum includes changing exhibitions, as well as an extensive permanent collection of landscape art and Native American exhibits. Lovely grounds look out over the Nashua River Valley and include the Alcott Farmhouse, a longhouse, dugout canoe, three sisters garden, and walking trails.

Friday, July 18th: Sandwich Glass Museum.

This museum is dedicated to bringing visitors a new understanding and appreciation of Sandwich town history, with particular emphasis on the unique contribution of the glass industry to the local community, the region, the nation, and the world.
