About The Presenter:

Dana Mueller was born and raised in Thuringia, East Germany until the fall of the Berlin Wall. She received her MFA in Photography from the Massachusetts College of Art + Design.

For the past years she has been photographing at the edges of a German village where the meadows and forest became part of the no-mans-land and former border between East and West Germany. This zone always presented an impenetrable entity and mystery to those who lived close to it. She grew up in the village and has been returning to photograph the inhabitants of this small German community with an interest in the quiet revelation of their lives while addressing aspects of *individual and collective identity within the context of recent German history*.



Mueller currently teaches at the Massachusetts College of Art + Design, Lesley University College of Art + Design and Northeastern University College of Art, Media + Design.
