December 15, 2003

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Mary Jo Rossetti called a Regular Meeting of the School Committee to order in the aldermanic chambers at 8:00 p.m., with a moment of silence and a salute to the flag of the United States of America.

V. STUDENT ADVISORY COUNCIL

Student representative Maya Nitzberg reported on the following items this evening:

Seniors – Student Update

Many seniors are in the midst of college angst while the pressure is on to complete their college and scholarship applications. Those students not going on to college are in the process of deciding their future plans after graduation. Ms. Nitzberg reported the guidance counselors and staff have been extremely helpful in directing the students, and in helping them to understand the process.

Sports

This week many of Somerville's legendary sports begin their season.

Hockey begins Wednesday, December 17th, playing at Malden – 6:00 p.m.

Boys and Girls Basketball Teams play Waltham, Tuesday, December 16th, the girls are away, boys are at home.

The varsity basketball team has a new Coach, Paul Garrity. The team is confident he will lead them all the way to victory.

Holiday Assembly

This week teachers are preparing for a spectacular holiday show for the students, which will be held on Tuesday, December 23rd. Ms. Nitzberg reported this is the show where teachers traditionally, *let their hair down*. They are very excited about this year's performance, knowing the students will thoroughly enjoy it.

In closing, Ms. Nitzberg wished everyone a wonderful and relaxing vacation.

Before moving on to the next item of the Superintendent's Report, Chairman Rossetti announced that the Somerville School Committee will be going into executive session at the end of tonight's meeting for the purpose of potential litigation.

VI. REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Argenziano reported on the following items:

1. Publicly thanked Kate Murray, Dennis Sullivan, Sean O'Donovan and Mayor Dorothy Kelly Gay for the time they served on the school committee and their assistance to the young people and staff of the Somerville Public Schools.
2. Briefly summarized for the committee what he told the parents of Powder House Community School students while he was at the school giving out Superintendent Award Certificates. The Superintendent stated that a year ago we had four schools, the Healey, the East Somerville Community School, the Lincoln Park Community School, and the Powder House Community School that were considered under performing. When the information was reported this time, the Powder House Community School, 8th grade math only, did not meet the level of adequate yearly performance and the headline in the newspaper was Powder House Community School Fails. Dr. Argenziano told the parents that if they read his soundbites, given to the reporter, they were congratulations to Susan Collins, who as Principal for a year and three months, took a school that was completely under performing in Grade 3, Grade 4, Grade 6, and Grade 8 and turned the building around. - Ms. Collins and her staff for a job well done. He also congratulated Mr. Driscoll and his staff, Mr. Johanson and his staff, and Ms. Davis and her staff.
3. Provided to members the Somerville School Committee letter sent to the Somerville Journal in response to the November 26th letter from Thomas Hedderick, former Finance Director of the City of Somerville.
 4. Enclosed is a copy of the letter from the American School Board Journal notifying the Superintendent that the program nominated for the Magna Awards 2004 *Success Plan for All Somerville High School Students* was not among those chosen for recognition this year.
 5. A draft schedule of the School Improvement Plans is enclosed for members. The tentative schedule is for Wednesday and Thursday, February 4 and 5, 2004.
 6. Provided to members is a final copy of the Somerville Public Schools 2004-2005 School Calendar.
 7. An article on *Charting a Course for Immigrant Youth in a Changing Commonwealth* is enclosed for members. Dr. Argenziano informed the committee that he and Congressman Capuano will be speaking at the New Young Americans Project at Suffolk University Law School in January.
 8. There are two head coach vacancy postings enclosed for members; one is for the position of Head Coach for Girls Soccer and the other is for the position of Head Varsity Football Coach, to be posted the middle of January.
 9. Provided to members is the *Model Policy for Late Night & Overnight School Sponsored Student Travel*, to be added to the Somerville Public Schools Policy Manual.
 10. Enclosed is a letter that was sent to Mr. Tuccelli, Winter Hill Community School Principal, by Bruce Campbell, Ward 4 Community Police Officer commending two students for their actions on November 17, 2003. Dr. Argenziano publicly commended both students, Sarah and Hugh Merisier, for receiving this nice letter from Mr. Campbell.

Ms. Harris made a request to have a citation presented to the Merisier family and to Officer Campbell at a School Committee meeting in January 2004.
 11. Announced the new date for the SATs is December 20, 2003. The communities of Malden, Medford, Everett, Somerville, and Cambridge have all received permission, including parochial schools, to have the make up from the December 8th date, cancelled due to a snowstorm.
 12. Reported there was 97% staff attendance after the two snow days of December 8th and 9th. On the following day back to school, only 32 teachers were out, and there was 98% student attendance. Dr. Argenziano commended the parents and staff for the high turnout following this major storm.

13. Confirmed that the Community Forum rescheduled date is Wednesday, January 14, 2004 at 6:30 p.m. at the East Somerville Community School.

VII. REPORT OF SUBCOMMITTEES

A. *Executive Session Meeting:* Ms. Rossetti (December 3)

Subject discussed:

- ✓ Annual Review of the Superintendent of Schools Performance

Ms. Rossetti reported that by a vote of eight yes and one absent, the following motion was approved:

- To increase the Superintendent's base salary for the period from January 1, 2004 through December 31, 2004 by three percent (3%). Two and one-quarter percent (2¼%) of the increase will be paid in lieu of the estimated \$3,000 expense reimbursement to which the Superintendent otherwise would be entitled under Section 8 of his employment contract for attendance at the 136th annual conference of the American Association of School Administrators, this year to be held in San Francisco, from February 19-24, 2004.

B. *Rules Management Committee of the Whole:* Ms. Cardoso (Dec. 4)

Subjects discussed:

- ✓ Policy Manual Revisions

A recommendation was made that the committee would meet, after January 1, 2004, to review the *Somerville Public Schools Policy Manual*, which consists of approximately fourteen sections. Members would divide the sections, share in the review, and make any revisions and/or changes necessary.

- ✓ Waiver Process (Question 2)

Ms. Cardoso reported that an addition was made to The Somerville Public Schools English Language Learners Waiver Request Form / 2003-2004 School Year, concerning the Appeals Process - Steps I and II, as follows:

Step I: Transition team consults with parents and makes a recommendation to District Administrator for Student Services

Step II: Parents meet with Superintendent of Schools

Motion from Committee of the Whole:

- To approve the revised Somerville Public Schools English Language Learners Waiver Request form, 2003-2004 school year, Appeals Process – Steps I and II.

VII. REPORT OF SUBCOMMITTEES (cont.)

- ✓ Overnight School Sponsored Student Travel

Ms. Cardoso reported committee members and the Superintendent of Schools reviewed the draft *Model Policy for Late Night & Overnight School Sponsored Student Travel* that was provided to them by the Department of Education. Items discussed included the trip approval process, transportation, i.e. the use of vehicles, and CORI regulations on individuals providing school related transportation to children.

MOTION: Ms. Cardoso made a motion, seconded by Ms. Harris, to approve the Model Policy for Late Night and Overnight School Sponsored Student Travel with a revision to section III. B. Transportation, #1 of the model policy, to read: the use of private vehicles for trips planned to include late night or overnight student travel should be avoided. Such trips should generally use commercial motorcoaches or school department vehicles driven by school department personnel.

The motion was approved by a roll call vote of: Yes—9—Cardoso, Harris, Gay, O'Donovan, Bauer, Sullivan, Taylor, Murray, and Rossetti.

C. *Ed. Programs and Instruction Subcommittee:* Ms. Bauer (Dec. 10)

Subjects discussed:

- ✓ Somerville High School 2004-2005 Program of Studies

Ms. Bauer reported that the revision process began earlier than usual and discussion included mostly requests for clarification and explanation of Somerville High School requirements and procedures. There was also discussion regarding corrections of typographical errors. The only substantive change requested by the School Committee was to add a sample calculation of GPA.

MOTION: Ms. Bauer made a motion, seconded by Ms. Taylor, to accept the draft of the Somerville High School 2004-2005 Program of Studies with recommendations made at the December 10, 2003 Educational Programs and Instruction Subcommittee meeting and with corrections of typographical errors. The motion was accepted by voice vote.

- ✓ Revision to grading policy

Ms. Bauer reported the discussion that took place concerning the difference between grades E and F, high and low failure.

MOTION: Ms. Bauer made a motion, seconded by Mr. Sullivan, that the use of two failing grades, "E" and "F", be discontinued at Somerville High School. Hereafter, a class average of 59% or less will merit a grade of "F" which can be made up in a subsequent grading period by a grade of at least a C-. All other provisions of the grading system will remain in effect.

✓ TAB Building Generator Request

Ms. Murray reported the conversation that took place regarding a permanent external generator at the Tufts Administration Building (TAB) and it being located on Tufts property, adjacent to the parking lot and back of the Powder House Community School. After discussion, it was decided the committee needed to have more correspondence around this issue with members of the Tufts community as well as the school community. A meeting will be scheduled in January 2004.

✓ Durrel School

Ms. Murray referred to previous conversation concerning the Durrel School and a request from Mayor Dorothy Kelly Gay, to declare the school no longer necessary for educational purposes. Further discussion was to take place at the Finance and Facilities Subcommittee meeting this evening but did not happen. At tonight's regular meeting, committee members received a letter from Mayor Gay concerning this issue. Ms. Murray stated this item will be brought up under Unfinished Business.

Responding to Ms. Murray's question of free cash and whether it has been certified, Mayor Gay stated she has not been officially notified by the Department of Revenue, but is hoping to have in the region of \$4 million certified. Ms. Taylor asked the Mayor if this were to happen, would it be possible to find the \$60,000 the school committee requested to make additional hires to support the second language learners in Somerville. The Mayor stated with the crisis the city is facing it would not be fiscally responsible of her to grant this money at this time and being honest and upfront with members of the committee advised she would not ask the Board for a supplemental appropriation of \$60,000.

Ms. Cardoso and Ms. Harris moved a motion to go into executive session at 9:35 p.m., to discuss potential litigation, and the motion was approved by a roll call vote of: Yes—9—Cardoso, Harris, Gay, O'Donovan, Bauer, Sullivan, Taylor, Murray, and Rossetti.
